RJ Cargo adds e-freight platform

ROYAL JORDANIAN Airlines has opted for Cargospot, the state-of-the-art cargo IT platform from Luxembourg-based CHAMP Cargosystems, to replace the existing in-house cargo system at its Amman hub.

The investment in a new IT environment is part of an initiative to enhance the air cargo infrastructure in the recently privatised carrier in all aspects of its sales, reservations, pricing, management information and cargo handling processes.

The airline's air freight division, RJ Cargo, which operates the cargo terminal at Queen Alia International airport, where it serves almost 30 airline clients, said it will fully implement the Cargospot system in October.

RJ Cargo's clients will be able to fully benefit from standard industry interfaces to finally handle cargo in an 'e-business' format with the carrier.

Royal Jordanian president and CEO Samer Majali noted that "the airline is fully dedicated to supporting the Jor-

danian government's initiatives to facilitate business with required investments".

He said that an electronic interface to the Jordanian Customs authorities would "greatly speed up processes for all clients" at the airline's Amman hub.

"The recent extension of Customs' operating hours has already yielded significant improvements for our customers," Samer added.

The airline is currently completing the second phase of the upgrade of its cargo terminal in Amman, which will include semi-automated racking systems and increased capacity for storage and rapid handling of import cargo.

Further sizeable investments in the storage and processing facilities are planned for the next 24 months.
